Position Vacant: CO-ORDINATOR, PRISON MINISTRY AND FIRST PEOPLES' PRISON CHAPLAINCY SERVICE, Queensland Synod

UnitingCare Queensland is seeking to fill the full-time placement of Co-ordinator to oversee the provision of the Uniting Church and First Peoples' prison chaplaincy services in Queensland. The role includes the selection, appropriate training and oversight of the part-time (mostly) volunteer chaplains who provide pastoral care across fourteen correctional centres in Queensland. The successful candidate will have demonstrated experience, understanding, and skills in pastoral ministry, preferably chaplaincy in an institutional setting. He or she will have the capacity to reflect theologically on the nature and practice of prison chaplaincy and the ability and understanding to work constructively and sensitively with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders. Both Blue and Yellow Cards checks will be essential.

Applications are invited for a new Project Officer position to develop leadership networks and strategies among UCA young adults from multicultural backgrounds.

The person will establish and coordinate a Synod-wide Next Generation CALD (Culturally and Linguistically Diverse) Leaders Network, providing encouragement, networking and training so that emerging CALD leaders might move into appropriate roles of influence and leadership and offer

their gifts and skills to enrich the mission and ministry of the Uniting Church in Congregations, Presbyteries, Synod and Assembly.

Interfaith September

Interfaith September is an opportunity to build understanding and friendship with people of other faiths.

As Christians, we believe diversity is a part of God's creation. Our faith in Christ calls us to live together in peace and love and to engage in genuine dialogue with people of other faiths.

In Australia today, there is much work to do healing divisions caused by ignorance and fear. But by reaching out to people of other faiths, we can make a difference.

On behalf of the Assembly Relations with Other Faiths Working Group, I extend a personal invitation to your congregation to take part in Interfaith September this year. You can participate in any way that suits you. You may follow the worship resource each week, theme a sermon, use a suggested hymn or host an event. You may choose another time of year that is more suitable. It is up to you.

This year we have produced four resources

- **Lectionary Guide** A week-by-week reflection on the gospels contained in the Lectionary for September with four different interfaith themes.
- **Worship Resource** Alongside the Lectionary Guide, the worship resource includes sermon starters, links to other resources, an Order of Service and other ideas.
- **Videos** Six videos sharing stories of interfaith friendship. These are matched with the four weekly themes of the Lectionary Guide and could be shared during worship or community gatherings.
- **Interfaith Action** Ideas and tips for how you can reach out to people of other faiths and build on understanding and friendship
