PD Workshop: Understanding Domestic & Family Violence and Sexual Violence across Migrant and refugee communities: Tues 25 October 2016 – South Brisbane

The Immigrant Women's Support Service (IWSS) has been providing a domestic and family violence service for over 30 years and a sexual assault service for nearly 20 years. IWSS is funded by the Queensland government to provide a specialist service for women from culturally and linguistically diverse backgrounds and their children in Brisbane. IWSS and JK Diversity Consultants are hosting this joint workshop to enhance build capacity and sector development for local service providers within the Brisbane region. This workshop is an activity under Sexual Violence Awareness Month. We seek to highlight the intersection between domestic and sexual violence and its impact on the lives of migrant and refugee women.

This workshop will cover the following topics:

- Acknowledging how culture, ethnicity and religion impact on communities understanding of domestic and family violence
- Intimate Partner Sexual Violence and the challenges for women in reporting and dealing with this type of abuse
- The Influence of gender roles & traditions within migrant and refugee communities
- Barriers to accessing support
- Culturally Sensitive Practice
- Risk Assessment & Safety Planning

It's hard enough to train kids to behave, but good behaviour isn't what God calls for. He wants hearts and souls that are shaped in vibrant faith and a love for Him and others. If we want our children to share our Faith in God, then we need to cultivate this in them, and we need to do it intentionally and Parenting Spiritually. On average, our children spend over 1000 hours a year at school, and less than 50 hours a year in church which leaves over 7000 hours that we as parents, spend with them, and have opportunity to pass on our core values.

Come along to hear how to be empowered as we as the church partner with you to make God relevant for you and your family, every day. The session will be presented by *Tracy Valentine*, the Children's - Early Years and Spiritual Parenting Pastor at Gateway Baptist Church. UnitingWorld Project Launch

UnitingWorld is launching a new project to support Peacemakers in the Presbyterian Church of South Sudan. Would you be able to put the following into the next Presbytery newsletter, please?

Reverend Paska has sat beside women and children who have lived all their lives at war. She's left her own family to be with mothers and daughters who have seen people cut down in front of them, their bodies left to lie in the streets. She's listened to the whispers of girls who can hardly speak of their abuse at the hands of soldiers. And she knows that the pathway to peace lies in hearing these voices, helping them speak to one another, learn hope, forgiveness, reconciliation and the practical skills to build a new life.

"Everyone in South Sudan has grown up with war, lived war, breathed war," Paska says. "But we have a vision for peace."

Reverend Paska is one of the Presbyterian Church of South Sudan's Peacemakers- men and women of God who are helping women recover from the trauma of rape; rebuilding schools and training teachers; leading advocacy for the peace process and helping people from different tribal groups come together to reconcile.

After years of conflict, and in a situation where thousands of people feel unsafe to return to their own homes, this practical ministry of the Church is a powerful witness to God's love and redemption. Through UnitingWorld, the Uniting Church in Australia is standing beside these Peacemakers, offering our prayer, advocacy and financial support.

Throughout September, congregations and communities of faith will be joining together to pray for South Sudan, eat a meal together and hear about the work of our Peacemakers.
